As the resident “equestrian services director”, Kala would like to remind you about what to expect here at Duckhaven Stud. We want you to have the best holiday possible, but there are some livery information that we have to abide by.

Bringing your horse on holiday

We welcome horses as well as humans here at Westward Living. Farriers cottage has a private paddock including field shelter, adjacent to the garden where you are welcome to bring your own horse at a small fee of £100 per week which includes hay and straw bedding.



Paddock: Your horse, whilst holidaying at Westward Living will have sole access to its own paddock and field shelter.

Provisions: We provide hay and straw bedding when required. Mucking out and hard food is to be provided by the you. Hard food can be made available at cost price.

Vets & Farrier: Our local vet and or farrier can be available to you if required during your horses stay here. This is not included as part of the fee, but will be at an additional cost to you should you require any service.

Health: Please make sure that your horse has been wormed before arrival. Westward Living can take no responsibility for any ill health or harm caused to your horse when staying here on site.

If Farriers cottage is already occupied for the dates that you require, please contact us to discuss possible alternative paddocks that may be available for your stay.

Meeting new animals: Please be aware, if your horse is skittish, that there are lots of animals here at Duckhaven Stud. Other horses, chickens, goats, rabbits and pheasants and nearby there are cows and sheep in the fields too.
